Bio Henrique Duarte

Graduated in journalism from the Federal University of Bahia (Brazil), Henrique Duarte is a film director and multimedia manager at CHAM - Center for the Humanities.

In cinema, he worked in the direction of photography, editing and sound design in some short films and, in 2018, released "Orin: music for the Orixás", his first feature film, signing the research, script, editing and direction. In the same year, the documentary was shown at several festivals, such as the Brasilia Festival of Cinema, the International Film and Transcendence Festival and, in 2019, received the Best Film Award from the Popular Jury of Mostra Sesc de Cinema. Since September 2019, the film has been part of the CineBrasilTV channel.

Among his main works are the series of institutional videos on the Forest Management Project for Sustainable Production in the Amazon (2019), a cooperation between the governments of Brazil and Germany, the advertising campaign 'Read and Pass on' (2015) and a series of videos on the Project for the Prevention of Drug Abuse in School Environments (2016), both coordinated by the Government of the State of Bahia, as well as the direct sound and the editing of the institutional film about the Journey of Water in the Pantanal (2018), organized by the NGO WWF-Brasil, and the web series 'Nenhum Quilombo a Menos' (2018), which was part of a campaign organized by the Instituto Socioambiental (ISA) to pressure the Supreme Court of Brazil (STF) to decide in favor of a decree that guaranteeing quilombolas the right to their lands.

He is currently a student of the master's degree in Aesthetics and Artistic Studies at NOVA FCSH, where he has developed an investigation on the relationship between music played in Brazilian candomblé and in the Orixás services in the Benin and Nigeria, for the making of a documentary on this topic.
